1 AMERICAN FELLOWSHIPS - SUMMER/SHORT-TERM RESEARCH PUBLICATION GRANTS

Summer/Short-Term Research Publication Grants fund women college and university faculty and independent researchers to prepare research for publication. Applicants may be tenure track, part-time, or temporary faculty or new or established scholars and researchers at universities. Time must be available for eight consecutive weeks of final writing, editing, and responding to issues raised in critical reviews. Funds cannot be used for undertaking research. Applicants must have received their doctorates by the application deadline. Scholars with strong publishing records should seek other funding.

2 CAREER DEVELOPMENT GRANTS

Career Development Grants support women who hold a bachelor's degree and who are preparing to advance their careers, change careers, or re-enter the work force. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents.

3 COMMUNITY ACTION GRANTS

Community Action Grants provide seed money to individual women, AAUW branches and AAUW state organizations, as well as local community-based nonprofit organizations for innovative programs or nondegree research projects that promote education and equity for women and girls. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents.

4 INTERNATIONAL FELLOWSHIPS

International Fellowships are awarded for full-time graduate or postgraduate study or research to women who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Supplemental grants support community-based projects in the fellow's home country.

5 SELECTED PROFESSIONS FELLOWSHIPS

Selected Professions Fellowships are awarded to women who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents and who intend to pursue a full-time course of study (during the fellowship year) in designated degree programs where women's participation traditionally has been low.

6 AAUW ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The AAUW Educational Foundation presents the AAUW Achievement Award biennially to a woman of outstanding achievement in an academic or professional field. There is neither age limit nor restriction on the field of the recipient, but the award is usually given to a mature woman whose accomplishments have spanned 10 years or more. An honorarium of \$10,000 accompanies the award.

7 ANNIE JUMP CANNON AWARD

Established by the American Astronomical Society (AAS) in 1934, the Annie Jump Cannon Award in Astronomy honors an untenured woman postdoctoral scholar for significant research in astronomy. The award amount is \$5,000.

8 AAUW LEGAL ADVOCACY FUND SUPPORT FOR SEX DISCRIMINATION LAWSUITS

The AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund provides funding and a support system for women seeking judicial redress for sex discrimination.

56 PLAINTIFF TRAVEL GRANTS

The grants aim to help states and regions increase knowledge of LAF and equity issues in higher education and to raise funds in support of LAF by bringing together AAUW members and women whose cases are being supported by the fund.

Grants are made for the cost of air travel for plaintiffs to event sites. Costs of room and meals may be included if funds permit. States and regions are encouraged to budget for some costs of the plaintiff's stay. They may, however, deduct necessary costs from gross receipts.

57 AMERICAN FELLOWSHIPS - POSTDOCTORAL RESEARCH LEAVE FELLOWSHIPS

Postdoctoral Research Leave Fellowships offer one-year support for women who will have earned a doctoral degree by Nov. 15, 2005. Postdoctoral fellowships are available in the arts and humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences; one is designated for a woman from an underrepresented group in any field. Limited additional funds may be available when matched by the fellow's institution.

58 AMERICAN FELLOWSHIPS - DISSERTATION FELLOWSHIPS

Dissertation Fellowships are available to women who will complete their dissertation writing between July 1, 2006, and June 30, 2007. To qualify, applicants must have completed all course work, passed all required preliminary examinations, and received approval for their research proposal or plan by Nov. 15, 2005.

59 ACS SCHOLARS PROGRAM

The American Chemical Society sponsors scholarship programs for qualified applicants who want to enter the fields of chemistry, biochemistry, or chemical engineering, and students seeking a two-year degree in chemical technology. The programs are designed to encourage African-American, Hispanic, and American Indian students to pursue undergraduate college degrees in the chemical sciences and chemical technology. The goal of these scholarship programs is to aid in building an awareness of the value and the rewards associated with careers in science and to assist students in acquiring the skills and credentials needed for success in these areas.

345 SMALL GRANTS PROGRAM

The Small Grants Program seeks to stimulate new and innovative research on food assistance and nutrition issues and to broaden the participation of social science scholars in these issues. Small grants last for 1 year; most are in the range of \$20,000 to \$40,000. The program is funded by ERS and is administered through selected universities and their associated research institutes located at five sites. The five institutions administer the application and peer review processes. Each of the institutions takes a different aspect of food assistance, nutrition, or subgroup of recipients as its primary focus.

346 FORMULA FUNDED GRANTS

Formula funded grants are provided to specific grantees on the basis of a formula, prescribed in legislation or factors as population, unemployment rate, per capita income, or a specific need.

347 COMPETITIVELY FUNDED GRANTS

Competitively funded grants are awarded through the solicitation process in ETA. When competitive grants are open for competition, ETA will post a Solicitation for Grant Application (SGA). The SGA provides information on the type of project ETA intends to fund and that clearly states what types of organizations are eligible. To compete for a grant, organizations develop a proposal and budget that demonstrate how the organization will provide services to a targeted population.

348 WORK INCENTIVE GRANTS

To enhance the One-Stop Career Center system and by providing comprehensive informational and assistance services on multiple programs for which people with disabilities are eligible.

349 DISABILITY PROGRAM NAVIGATOR INITIATIVE

This initiative promotes comprehensive services and work incentive information for SSA beneficiaries and other individuals with disabilities through the One-Stop system.

350 SCIENCE TO ACHIEVE RESULTS (STAR) RESEARCH GRANTS

The STAR program funds research grants in numerous environmental science and engineering disciplines through a competitive solicitation process and independent peer review. The program engages the nation's best scientists and engineers in targeted research that complements EPA's laboratory research and research conducted by our partners in other federal agencies.

419 INDIVIDUAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Individual Assistance mission of the Response and Recovery Division is to ensure that individuals and families that have been affected by disasters have access to the full range of Response and Recovery programs in a timely manner and that the best possible level of service is provided to applicants in the administration of these programs.

420 FREE LEGAL COUNSELING

The Young Lawyers Division of the American Bar Association, through an agreement with FEMA, provides free legal advice for low-income individuals regarding cases that will not produce a fee (i.e., those cases where attorneys are paid part of the settlement which is awarded by the court). Cases that may generate a fee are turned over to the local lawyer referral service.

421 EMERGENCY FOOD AND SHELTER NATIONAL BOARD PROGRAM

The Emergency Food and Shelter National Board Program was created in 1983 to supplement the work of local social service organizations within the United States, both private and governmental, to help people in need of emergency assistance.

422 FIRE MANAGEMENT ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM (FMAGP)

The Fire Management Assistance Grant Program (FMAGP) provides a 75 percent Federal cost share and the State pays the remaining 25 percent for actual costs. Before a FMAGP, grant can be awarded to a State must demonstrate that total eligible costs for the declared fire meet or exceed either the individual fire cost threshold, which is applied to each fire, or the cumulative fire cost threshold, which recognizes numerous smaller fires burning throughout a State. Eligible firefighting costs covered under the may include expenses for field camps; equipment use, repair and replacement; tools, materials and supplies; and mobilization and demobilization activities.

423 ASSISTANCE TO FIREFIGHTERS GRANT PROGRAM

The purpose of these grants is to enhance the safety of the public and firefighters with respect to fire and fire-related hazards. The primary goal of the AFG Fire Prevention and Safety Grant (FP&S) is to reach high-risk target groups in order to mitigate the high incidences of death and injuries.

424 FLOOD MITIGATION ASSISTANCE (FMA)

Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) provides funding to assist States and communities in implementing measures to reduce or eliminate the long-term risk of flood damage to buildings, manufactured homes, and other structures insurable under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

425 PRE-DISASTER MITIGATION (PDM)

Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) provides funding for cost-effective hazard mitigation activities that complement comprehensive mitigation programs, reduce injuries, loss of life, and damage and destruction of property. Projects funded through PDM must be located physically in a participating NFIP community that is not on probation or suspended (if the community has been mapped through the NFIP).

385 LOAN GUARANTEE

Ex-Im Bank assists exporters by guaranteeing term financing to creditworthy international buyers, both private and public sector, for purchases of U.S. goods and services. With Ex-Im Bank's loan guarantee, international buyers are able to obtain competitive term financing from lenders when financing is otherwise not available or there are no economically viable interest rates on terms over one-to-two years.

386 FINANCE LEASE GUARANTEES

Ex-Im Bank supports competitive medium-term financing structured as finance leases in addition to financing structured as installment loans. Support of lease financing is important since some foreign buyers of U.S. capital goods prefer lease financing as an alternative to traditional installment loans. Ex-Im Bank will guarantee lease financing of U.S. goods and services to creditworthy international lessees, both private and public sector, when financing is otherwise not available or applicable interest rates are not economically viable.

387 DIRECT LOAN

Ex-Im Bank assists exporters by providing fixed-rate loans to creditworthy international buyers, both private and public sector, for purchases of U.S. goods and services.

388 ENVIRONMENTAL EXPORTS PROGRAM

Ex-Im Bank is committed to increasing the level of support it provides to U.S. exporters of environmentally beneficial goods and services, as well as to U.S. exporters participating in environmental projects located internationally. To achieve this objective, Ex-Im Bank's Environmental Exports Program (EEP) provides enhanced levels of financial support for a broad range of renewable energy and other environmentally beneficial exports.

389 MEDICAL EQUIPMENT INITIATIVE

The Medical Equipment Initiative (MEI) offers solutions to increase the export of medical equipment from U.S. companies to foreign borrowers that would not go forward without Ex-Im Bank support. The MEI includes creative financing structures and enhanced coverage.

390 TRANSPORTATION SECURITY EXPORTS PROGRAM (T-SEP)

The international trading system is critical to U.S. economic and national security. Consequently, the U.S. government gives high priority to programs that bolster the security of systems that support the movement of passengers and cargo between countries.

The Export-Import Bank of the United States (Ex-Im Bank) has responded to the challenge with the Transportation Security Exports Program (T-SEP). This initiative provides enhanced financing support for U.S. exports that are related to international transportation security.
